

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

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Drop Off and Pick Up Locations

• Drop Off: is outside in the parking area nearest the soccer arena. A table will be set up with staff to assist with sign in.

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- Campers must be dropped off by 9 am and must attend the first day of camp each week to hold their spot.
- Campers may be picked up at any time, once picked up campers may not return that day.
- Pick Up: if picking up before 4 pm, the sign out binders will be located at the front desk of the YMCA. A front desk staff member will assist you in checking your ID and sign out. Staff will radio the counselor and inform them the camper is going home. Staff will provide authorized pick up a slip to hand over to the counselor when picking up. This slip will tell the counselor that the authorized pick up person has had their ID checked and the camper has been properly signed out.
- If picking up after 4 pm, the sign out binders will be available in the same location as drop off.
- Please note that camp swim happens between 2 pm-3:30 pm. If you will be picking your camper up early, we recommend refraining from swim that day so that you can have a quick pick up.
